Derbyshire County Council, Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 – The Derbyshire County Council (B6388 and Adjacent Road, High Lane) (Restricted Road and 40mph Speed Limit) Order 2024

Derbyshire County Council proposes to introduce a 40mph Speed limit on the B6388 from a point 235 metres North West of its junction with Pheonix Road to a point 1060 metres North West of the same junction. The proposed 40mph Speed Limit replaces the existing derestricted Speed Limit between to 30mph Speed Limit sections of the B6388.

The proposed amendments to the B6388 Speed Limit are due to safety concerns following a fatal Road Traffic Collision on the 1st July 2023

It is considered that the proposed changes are consistent with the County Councils policy and circular 01/2013, which gives Local Authorities guidance upon the setting of local speed limits.

I have enclosed a copy of the proposal drawings for your attention and should be pleased to receive any initial comments you may have by 30th August 2024.

Subject to the feedback you will then receive a further consultation package that will include any necessary amendments to the proposals with a copy of the statutory public notice, a period of time which will allow for any formal comments to be received during the 21 days of its publicised advertisement.
