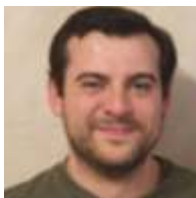

Our cemetery contains over 10,000 graves and 16,000 interments have taken place in the 146 years the cemetery has been in use.


