## STEAD STREET PARK UPDATE

Our new large play area at Stead St, complete with cafe and facilities, is now well on the way. The site has been acquired, planning permission received, and work has started.

The old youth club will be demolished shortly, with work on the play equipment and new cafe starting immediately after.

While the site is under construction, there are some temporary changes to access. The main path, highlighted in orange (see diagram), will be closed, and a temporary diversion created, highlighted in red. The contractors will be making an access through the hedge for people to walk through to join Back Lane, highlighted in blue colour.

## **D-Day Remembered**




The 80th anniversary of the D-Day landings was observed by our community, with a great lunch and music by Ian King.

#### **MUGA and Pump Track**

At the parish council owned field off Pipeyard Lane (the 'rec', near the Miners Welfare) there is a MUGA (multi-user games area). This can be used for football and other ball games throughout the year, and there are hoops for netball etc.

The Parish Council are now in discussions to build a 'Pump Track' there - this is a cycle circuit, aimed at teenagers, and will be a great addition to the youth facilities in Eckington. It will be at the Pipeyard Lane side of the field.

## **REMEMBRANCE DAY**

Following the spate of car thefts from the parish, Eckington Parish Council have funded purchase of a new ANPR (automatic number plate recognition) camera to monitor the roads in our Parish.

ANPR cameras continuously monitor traffic and compare licence plate numbers against databases of known offenders and suspect vehicles, so police can quickly identify and apprehend criminals before they have a chance to commit further offences.

Our local police are immediately alerted if a criminal vehicle shows up, and after recent upgrades, the ANPR system is fully integrated into a national system, especially useful with our proximity to Sheffield, and it can even detect cloned number plates.



We look forward to celebrating Remembrance Day. This year, Remembrance Sunday is on 10th November 2024.

The Eckington parade will commence at 9:30am from the One Stop shop to St Peter and Paul Church.

The Service will be held inside the church, followed by wreath laying at the War Memorial outside.

Wreath laying will also take place at War Memorials at Renishaw, Ridgeway and Marsh Lane at 11am.

Remembrance Day is a special day for our community and last year the attendance was fantastic. We hope you will join us again on this special day.

## **DEFIBRILLATORS**

A defibrillator is a vital way to save a life if someone has a cardiac arrest. By using a defibrillator, the survival chances increase by up to 70%.

Currently, there are nine defibrillators installed around the Parish. The last one was donated by Eckington Boys & Bells to be installed at Stead Street Cafe & Park. Those are the locations where you can find accessible defibrillators:

- Eckington Civic Centre
- Eckington Swimming Bath
- One Stop shop, Eckington
- Miners Welfare, Eckington
- The Gate Inn, Troway
- Fir Road Shops, Eckington
- Strata Estate, Eckington
- Green Lawns, Marsh Lane

People are often unsure about how a defibrillator works. The instructions are clearly written or recorded to each defibrillator. Also Eckington Parish Council organise training courses for the public, announced on our website.
